
I am looking forward to working with all of you again this year. We have many fantastic charitable and family events already planned. As always, information about our events can be found on our website (kc1437.org).

Your Shield For Life

Only having "through work" insurance doesn't work.

Do you know anyone whose life or career has been drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It's very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty now. You could one day find yourself without coverage, and if your health has changed (which it will as you age), you might also find yourself unable to secure individual protection. It will definitely be more expensive.
