The Father Michael J. McGivney Guild serves as a source of information about the life, works and spirituality of Father McGivney, our founder. The Guild distributes information materials about him, receives reports of favors granted through his intercession and oversees the distribution of relics. There are more than 132,000 members of the Father McGivney Guild.

The purpose of the Guild is to inspire personal areater holiness cooperation with God's grace bν disseminating information about Father "The Guild's goal is to McGivnev. spread the good word about Father holiness McGivnev's of life. encourage devotion in his memory and seek his intercession before the throne of God," said Dominican Father Gabriel O'Donnell, quild director postulator of father McGivney's cause for canonization.

The Knights of Columbus founded the Guild in 1997 concurrently with the phase archdiocesan of Father McGivney's cause for canonization. Membership in the Guild, which is free, open to all individuals and households. but not to groups.

Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild members and must elect to join the Guild. The Father Michael J. McGivney Guild Newsletter is published bimonthly except July-August, and is free to Guild members.

Culture of Life Update

Louisiana Named Most Prolife State in the U.S.

Americans United for Life Ranks LA #1 because of Pro-Life Laws and Tireless Effort.

Recently this week, Americans United for Life, for the second year in a row, ranked Louisiana as the most pro-life state in the nation! AUL's "Life List"

ranks all 50 states based on the way each deals with a comprehensive list of life issues, ranging from abortion to euthanasia.

Americans United for Life states. "Louisiana tops the list because it has a decades-long history of enacting commonsense limitations on abortion; it comprehensively protects also healthcare freedom of conscience and is one of only a small number of states that has enacted meaningful regulations on biotechnologies such as destructive embryo research."

Benjamin Clapper, Executive Director of Louisiana Right to Life, stated, "We are honored to once again be named the most pro-life state, and we are thankful for those that have worked tirelessly over the past 40 years to restore the right to life in our great state."

Louisiana Right to Life led the effort to pass two flagship pieces of legislation in 2012 that cemented the #1 ranking for the second year in a row.

The first law, the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, protects unborn children 20 weeks old (post-fertilization) and older based on the scientific evidence showing that the unborn child can feel pain at 20 weeks.

The second law, the **Hear the Heartbeat Act,** requires abortion facilities to make the unborn child's heartbeat audible for the mother at least 24 hours prior to an abortion.

"While we are thankful for the great honor of being ranked as the most prolife state in the U.S. for a second year, we must be mindful that everyday in



Louisiana, 22 women still choose abortion. We face new threats to the dignity of life constantly in Louisiana. We must continue our efforts to defend life until all life is protected under law," Clapper finished.















Culture of Life Legislative Initiative

As Catholics, Knights of Columbus have the responsibility to work for the common good society. Catholics--and especially Knights--must, in the words of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, "embrace their citizenship not merely as a duty and a privilege, but as an opportunity to participate in building the culture of life. Every voice matters in the public forum. Every voice counts. Every act of responsible citizenship is an exercise of significant individual power." The Culture of Life Legislative Initiative seeks to assist councils in becoming more effective in the public sphere.
