groom speaks out of turn or the president mispronounces names. It’s that the wine ran out too early!

That shouldn’t sound too surprising. John tells us that it’s the third day of the wedding banquet. Three days of partying – a lot of wine! – and if they were particularly thirsty, we can imagine the well ran dry. Today, we might nervously ask friends to go to the local stop-and-rob pick up more. But in Jesus time, running out was not just embarrassing, it was a disaster! Wine isn’t just a social lubricant; it’s a sign of the harvest and God’s abundance. When they run short, think of it this way – they run short on blessing. Timing is everything. The wine ran out before the wedding is over. Catastrophe!

Timing is everything! But do you know how to tell time? You might think it’s 8:45AM on a Tuesday morning and all that’s in front of you is a pile of invoices. Maybe it’s 6:30PM on a Wednesday evening and its time to start the kids’ homework. Maybe it’s 7:00AM on a Saturday morning – time to sleep in! That’s part of the story. But the other part is that God is at work in our occupations, relationships and family life to redeem the world. How do you look at the ordinary, mundane elements of life if you believe God was with us, working through us to care for the people of God? According to Mary and John, because of Jesus, whatever time we think it may be is also God’s time, and when God is around, all things are possible.

On the October 11th – 13th, The Knights of Columbus of Ascension of Our Lord Council 9623, Laplace, traveled to Beaumont, Texas to offer relief for the victims of Tropical Storm Imelda.

Perhaps the day I hate more than any is Black Friday. I remember one year I wanted a new piece of electronic equipment. As I was looking through the paper on Thanksgiving that year, I noticed that Best Buy had it for sale. I knew that the item would be popular and that it would fly off the shelves, and that I would have to get up at the crack of dawn to be in line to get the item since the store opened at 4:00AM. But I had a secret – I knew a parishioner who worked at Best Buy. I figured that instead of waiting in line, I would show up around 3:55AM, call him up, and he would let me into the store before everyone else. Of course, when I arrived at Best Buy there was a line from here to Rome! I picked up my cell phone, called and texted him, and asked him to let me through the side door. But he didn’t answer. I waited in line. When I got to the door, I was told that my item was now sold out. I caught sight of my parishioner out of the corner of my eye and flagged him over. I asked him “Can’t you just squeeze me in here so I can get my item?” But he sadly shook his head and walked away.

Can I tell you that wasn’t the news I wanted to hear! I wanted to get my item as cheap as possible without any inconvenience. So too does the Gospel often give news we don’t want to hear.
