

ABORTION NUMBERS FALL; MORE PEOPLE PRO-LIFE? National Right to Life

The number of abortions performed in the U.S. continues to decline, according to the 2013 "Abortion Surveillance Report" recently released by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.



Relying on reports from state health departments, the CDC reported 664,435 abortions for 2013, down more than 5 percent from the 2012 total of 699,202 and more than 9 percent from the 2011 total of 730,322. While it provides a snapshot into the downward trend in abortions, this figure does not provide a complete picture of abortion in the U.S. as it does not include abortion data from California, the nation's most populous state, New Hampshire and Maryland.

In addition to the decline in the raw numbers of abortions, the CDC finds that both the abortion rate, (the number of abortions for every 1,000 women of child-bearing age) and the abortion ratio (the number of abortions per 1,000 live births) have declined. In the states included in the report, the CDC found an abortion rate of 12.5 abortions for every 1,000 women aged 15-44. The CDC found a ratio of 200 abortions per 1,000 live births.

"The decline in the number of abortions, and in the abortion rates and ratios, is a clear indication that pregnant women are increasingly less likely to see abortion as the desired solution to an unexpected pregnancy," said Randall K. O'Bannon, Ph.D.,

National Right to Life director of education and research. "Right-to-life legislative, educational and outreach efforts to increase awareness of the unborn child's humanity certainly continue to play a critical role in the abortion decline."

While this is good news, there is concerning news as well. Data shows that chemical or "medical" abortions continued to rise, a clear indication that the aggressive push of these by the abortion industry and its media allies is having some impact. Though these new abortions are nowhere near as simple and safe as the promoters of the abortion pill have promised but instead have turned out to be grueling, bloody, and painful, they have enabled the industry to expand abortion to smaller, more lightly staffed locations that may not possess the medical facilities or equipment of larger clinics or doctors with the surgical training to handle chemical abortion complications or failures. "Clinics that prescribe abortion pills instruct women to flush their baby down the toilet. But many women panic once they see their baby and don't know what to do." The place in the home where the baby was aborted – often the bathroom or a bedroom – also often becomes a place of trauma and recurring memories for these women..."

CHIMERA FUNDING UPDATE AND A LOOK AHEAD

Although it has been several months since last I wrote to ask your help to defend human life when the National Institutes of Health, (NIH) called for public comments about animal-human "chimera" experimentation, I have not forgotten my promise to keep you posted on developments.

I am happy to report that the overwhelming majority of the almost twenty thousand public comments submitted to the Office of Science Policy were from us! You can see the comment tally by clicking here. Thank you for all the time and effort you took to raise your voice in defense of human life. We understand that NIH is still evaluating the comments and that no action has yet been taken to lift the funding moratorium. We will keep watching this and let you know if there are future significant developments.

Looking ahead to a new Congress and a new Administration, we hope to see action on a number of pro-life priorities. Some bills we may see include No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion, Unborn Child Pain Awareness Act, Born Alive Abortion Survivors Act, and an effort to redirect funding from abortion clinics like Planned Parenthood.

And, of course, we continue to hold as a priority the enactment of the policy of the Conscience Protection Act! Future action on this vital goal is likely in 2017 and I know we will be able to count on your help when it is time for the grassroots to engage and proclaim the Gospel of Life to the members of Congress!

OCTOBER PRO-LIFE WORK Joseph R. Giardina, Council 4508

Council 4508 in Metairie placed a respect for life sign on the fence in front of the church along with small white crosses on the ground in front of the sign. This does not sound like a lot, but it was effective. We also join the Monday Night Disciples once a month to picket in front of the Planned Parenthood abortion clinic. We also prayed the rosary, the Divine Mercy chaplet, and a short version of the Way of the Cross. We used to picket

at the Ridgelake Abortion Clinic, and it closed by the grace of God.

Our council also placed a series of pro-life messages in the St Christopher Church bulletin each week during "Respect for Life Month" in October. Here are the messages:

Week of Oct 1st & 2nd: Let us remember that we are made of body and soul; and are made to the image and likeness of God. When Jesus was asked by the disciples, "When will we see the Father?" Jesus answered, "When you see Me you see the Father." We are made to the image of the Father; however, the Father is said to be larger than the universe and His divine nature is so bright that He lights up all of Heaven. The Baltimore Catechism tells us that we are created by God in His image to know Him, love Him and serve Him in this world and be happy with Him in the next (Heaven). Respect for every human life is respecting God; for Jesus said, what you do for the lease of my brethren you do for me. So, let us resect all human life, no matter who it may be from conception to natural death.

Week of 7th & 8th: There are many ways to respect the life of others. We can be respectful by simply being polite; listening; considering other's feelings; giving a helping hand when we can; visiting a sick person; praying for others; and most of all keeping God's commandments, which is all about respect for others and God.

Week of 15th & 16th: Let us pray for the sick; those that are victims of human trafficking; mistreated children; the homeless; the hungry; those grieving; and all those in despair. May the prayers of the faithful (you) continue for them and may the mercy of God fall upon them.

Week of 21st & 22nd: Respecting the aging is the same as respecting those still in the womb; meaning that those in the womb will become the aging in due time. A person is the same creation when in the womb as when he or she is an adult. Human life is a gift from God, made up of body and soul. When you respect the body you nourish the soul.

Week of 30th & 31st: Human life is the greatest gift from God that we have. This life allows us the ability to one day, be in a glorified body living in

the presence of God. That ability depends on how we use our free will while in exile here on Earth. Do we respect our bodies with Dignity (conducting ourselves properly); Chastity (dressing morally); Speech (all vulgar and obscene words come from Satan – Jesus's words, not mind); and loving God with our whole heart, mind and soul and loving our neighbor as our self? May we all be vigilant in respecting this great gift – LIFE.

The Pregnancy Problem Center (PPC) in Baton Rouge was in need of a medical table to be used with their new ultrasound machine. We made a call to the Women's New Life Center to see if they knew of an available table, and sure enough, they knew of two used tables at Women's Hospital and that we could choose the one we liked.

Several knights from our council picked up the table and placed it in the PPC. It is perfect! One of our knights purchased a 32 inch monitor and installed it as well. With the help of Dr. Veilon and Dr. Gravvoir, the PPC has been training ultrasound sonographers.

We will put our crosses out on the church lawn in January. During the week of the Epiphany, we will have our youth group gather after the 6 PM mass for a special ceremony where they will have an opportunity to name a spiritually adopted baby by hanging a card with the babies name on the crosses.

ACTIVITIES AT DELTA IN BATON ROUGE Jamie Johnson

Each day, sidewalk counselors faithfully pray and offer help to people seeking an abortion at the Delta abortion mill in Baton Rouge.

On December 13th, pro-life prayer warriors observed the use of five escorts for the first time in many months. These escorts are also referred to as "death-scorts" because they are in the business of assisting in the murder of innocent babies. Unfortunately, they are very effective in blocking out our counselors by trying to hurry the cars into the Delta parking lot, and escorting the victims into the clinic. They cover the back and front of the clinic. We really do not know why they have started coming back. Fr. David Nix from Gibson, LA who has been coming out to Delta on a regular basis is of the opinion that our prayer warriors and counselors are doing a good job and hurting Delta's killing business. RECENT PRO-LIFE ACTIVITIES Dan Dore, Council 7856

The Knights of Columbus Council 7856 comprised of members from Mount Carmel Catholic Church (St. Francisville, LA), and Mission Chapel of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (Jackson, LA) continued its participation in the Knights of Columbus Culture of Life Program. This program is a commitment to defending the right to life of every human being, from the moment of conception to natural death. Across the nation, councils and individual knights conduct projects aimed at building a Culture of Life in their individual communities.

Within the program parameters, KC Council 7856 has, for several years, conducted fund raising efforts to support the local program. This year, the major program was to help raise funds to benefit the Family Life Federation, also known as the Problem Pregnancy Center, located at 4724 Jamestown Avenue in Baton Rouge. The agency offers free services to women throughout their pregnancy. The services offered include: pregnancy tests,

counseling, abortion alternatives, adoption information, natural family planning, nutrition and educational programs. In the last year, the Center has served over 1,000 women in crisis pregnancies in the Baton Rouge area. Unfortunately, their grant funding has been negatively impacted by state budget cuts.

On December 7, 2016, KC member Phillip Gordy and Program Chairperson Daniel Doré presented Executive Director Frances Broussard with a check for \$3,500. Mrs. Broussard commented that she had been praying and wondering how the center was going to meet some of its financial obligations and in walked Santa with a wonderful present.

On December 8, 2016, KC Council 7856 also donated \$250 to the Woman's New Life Center. The center is located at 760 Colonial Drive, Baton Rouge, LA 70806 – next door to the Delta (abortion) Clinic. Woman's New Life Center also provides confidential care and support for unplanned pregnancies and reproductive health. The final program activity for the calendar year was to make a \$500 donation to help defray the cost of the young people from the church parish taking part in the March for Life in Washington D.C.

COUNCILS PARTNER TO PROVIDE AN ULTRASOUND MACHINE

As we are keenly aware, there are many people directly impacted by the great flood of 2016. One the local pregnancy resource centers, <u>Caring to Love Ministries</u>, located on N. Flannery Road in Baton Rouge received more than \$400,000 in damage. The center lost three ultrasound machines obtained through the K of C <u>Ultrasound Initiative</u>.



This center is particularly important because it is located in an area with a high risk population that is particularly susceptible to abortion. Prior to the flood, this center served about 200 new clients each month, many of whom are abortion-minded. More women are coming to the center after the flood. They too have been directly impacted by the flood, so there is more pressure to turn to abortion.

A team effort was need to raise half of the necessary funds to purchase another ultrasound for the center through the Ultrasound Initative at a cost of \$33,600. Donations were received from Council 4442 in Salem, NH, Council 9431 in Jackson WY, and Council 3743 in Baton Rouge, LA.



COUNCILS HELPS PREGNANCY CENTER WITH FLOOD RECOVERY

As many of you may already be aware, one of the pregnancy centers in Baton Rouge, Caring to Love Ministries (CTLM) was devastated by the terrible The center is located at 3813 N Flannery CTLM also lost three ultrasound machines Road. acquired through the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative. Recently, four different councils teamed-up to raise funds to acquire another through the Ultrasound ultrasound machine During a related visit, we learned that Initiative. they still have a lot of physical damage that prevents them from operating properly.

Therefore, a work day was scheduled at the center on Saturday, November 17th. Knights from Council 3743 Council 9247, and Council 13632 participated in this event. Workers moved medical equipment and furniture into the newly renovated clinic and painted interior walls. Representatives from Columbia magazine and the Catholic Commentator were there, so look for a future article in both publications. Thanks to all the volunteers for making this a big success.



Let sleeping towns lie! In The Seventh Word, residents of a small town are chosen to confront the evil lurking beneath the starched white masks of an abortion clinic.



LIFE ISSUES FORUM: GOOD NEWS OF A GREAT JOY

As we celebrate the birth of our Lord, the introduction from Pope Saint John Paul II's encyclical Evangelium Vitae provides a rich source of reflection on God's love for human life, which He created in His image and likeness:

"At the dawn of salvation, it is the birth of a child which is proclaimed as joyful news: 'I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord' (Lk. 2:10-11). The source of this 'great joy' is the birth of the Savior; but Christmas also reveals the full meaning of every human birth, and the joy which accompanies the birth of the Messiah is thus seen to be the foundation and fulfillment of joy at every child born into the world (cf. Jn. 16:21)."

It is amazing to contemplate that the eternal Son of God became man and experienced every stage and aspect of the human condition, except sin. He was conceived in the Virgin Mary and took the form of a human being, beginning life like every human being—as a single-celled embryo.

According to Scripture, after the Incarnation of our Lord, Mary went in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who was six months pregnant with John the Baptist. Given that it would have taken two to three days for Mary to reach Elizabeth, it's possible that Jesus had not yet implanted in Mary's womb (implantation occurs 5-7 days after conception) when His presence caused John to stir in Elizabeth's womb: "For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy." (Luke 1:44).

C. S. Lewis provides another source of reflection on the sanctity of all human life in The Weight of Glory: "The dullest and most uninteresting person you can talk to may one day be a creature which, if you saw it now, you would be strongly tempted to worship. ... There are no ordinary people. ... Next to the Blessed Sacrament itself, your neighbor is the holiest object presented to your senses."

With these thoughts in mind, I cannot imagine a better way to celebrate the birth of our Lord in a humble stable in Bethlehem, and to celebrate the gift of every human life, than to support a local pregnancy help center or maternity home. These centers do extraordinary work and truly represent the heart of the pro-life movement's goal of making abortion unthinkable.

Another way to make a difference is through our prayers and sacrifices. Taking place January 21-29, 2017, 9 Days for Life (www.9daysforlife.com) is the U.S. bishops' annual period of prayer and action for life. Each day of the novena provides a different intercession, reflection, information item and suggested action. The novena is available in English and Spanish, and can be received in four ways: a free mobile app, text message, email, or social media.

May the good news of the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ bring great joy to all—comforting the afflicted, deepening respect for all human life, and strengthening us to share the Gospel of Life.
