BOSSIER ABORTION FACILITY IS CLOSED!

Good news!

The Bossier City Medical Suite, an abortion facility in Bossier City, has permanently closed its doors (<u>CLICK HERE FOR MORE</u>). There is now one less facility in Louisiana destroying the lives of innocent unborn babies!

This abortion facility has been open for many years, likely into the 1980s. From just 2006 to 2015, this facility sold 7,482 abortions. We mourn for these lives that will never enjoy life in Louisiana.

Moving forward, we rejoice that this facility will no longer be in the business of abortion.

We recognize the tireless effort of many sidewalk counselors and prayer leaders, including those with 40 Days for Life Shreveport/Bossier. This closure

happened just days before the end of the spring 40 Days for Life campaign!

As the pro-life community, we must continue providing help to mothers and babies, both before and after birth. We must also keep a peaceful presence at these facilities, offering hope even in the most difficult places. We must never give up!

We look forward to a day when all babies are protected by law and welcomed with joy!



PREGANCY CARE CENTER Louisiana Right to Life

We are excited to see that the Cenla Pregnancy Center is taking one more step toward opening its doors to help mothers and babies in Alexandria and beyond! <u>LIFE ISSUES FORUM:</u> <u>PRO-WOMAN IS PRO-LIFE</u>

Recent cultural conversations on the importance of women's advancement have increasingly included abortion access, perpetuating a tragic assumption that 'pro-woman' and 'pro-life' are diametrically opposed viewpoints. This belief ignores the full reality of the beauty and dignity of all human life. To be pro-woman is to be pro-life; one cannot exist without the other.

Abortion has negative outcomes for both a woman and her child, with the two-fold loss including both the destruction of the child's very life and the destruction of the mother's well-being. The aftermath of abortion for a woman often includes psychological traumatization, and sometimes physical harm. Far from promoting dignity and freedom, abortion promotes the lie that a woman must harm herself and her child in order to be free.

The idea that abortion empowers women is one of many lies in society that are, in reality, incredibly harmful to women. How many other areas in culture have women been told to endure pain and a "quick fix" for their own advancement, whether through the fashion industry, eating disorders, or cosmetic surgery? Abortion advocates perpetuate the myth that women must "jump through hoops" and do violence to themselves in order to preserve their equality and the freedom to advance in the world.

Many women have rightly rejected the myth that they must "jump through hoops" just to be acknowledged and valued as human beings. The authentic, pro-woman position demands a woman be loved and valued for her own sake, exactly as she is—not because she has compromised herself. Abortion is anti-woman because it attacks some of what is most true and beautiful within a woman. Abortion is the very antithesis to a woman's ability to nurture and bring forth new life.

Abortion advocates treat pregnancy like a problem or a disease. Pregnancy is not the problem; it's the lack of care for the woman—for her own dignity and life-giving ability—that's the problem. When society devalues motherhood and the ability to nurture life, making these things a source of shame

and inconvenience, it increases the likelihood of a woman feeling like she has no option other than to abort her own child.

We are called to love. A woman facing an unplanned pregnancy should never feel like she must face it alone. She needs to know that others truly care about her dignity and well-being, and that there is help through a variety of sources, especially from local diocesan resources like the Respect Life office, Catholic Charities office, or local pregnancy help centers and maternity homes. Both mother and child deserve experienced care and compassion; both deserve a future filled with hope.

As we bear witness to and build the culture of life, in what ways can we show support, both for mothers facing unplanned pregnancies and for all women and the unique challenges they face? Society often objectifies women and tells them they need to reject their procreative and nurturing abilities just to be equal to men and to feel respected. But there is much we can do, in our personal witness, to counter these lies. When we celebrate and support women in all their unique gifts and contributions—including their life-giving capacity—they will be encouraged to make life-affirming choices for both themselves and their children.

To be pro-woman is to be pro-life. If we want to change the cultural conversation, we must be a part of it.

MAGDALENE INSTITUTE

One of our Culture of Life Chair couples, Kevin and Mary Langlois from Council 12906 in Covington is involved in the Magdalene Institute.

The Magdalene Institute is a Catholic-inspired nonprofit organization committed to sharing highquality research and scholarship on the topic of abortion. The Magdalene Institute stands for the principle that since human life is a gift from God and begins at conception, procured abortion at any time during the human being's development is without exception a grave violation of the most important and fundamental human right, the right to life. Therefore, we oppose legalized abortion, without exceptions, from conception until birth. We cannot support incremental measures to limit abortion in some cases, since these, if enacted into law, permit abortion in other cases. When continuing a pregnancy verifiably endangers the life of the mother, we believe every effort must be made to spare both lives, but if the child dies during medical treatment, he or she deserves the same respect that any dying person should receive.

<u>CULTURE OF LIFE MONTHLY REPORT</u> Michael & Catherine Abbate (Council 9623)

Council 9623 Culture of Life couple is leading a regular Pro-Life Rosary at the Adoration Chapel. On April 10th, Council Culture of Life Couple sent e-mail notes to defund Planned Parenthood Act of 2017 (HR-354) to President Donald Trump, US Representative Garret Graves, US Senators Bill Cassidy and John Kennedy. Also, the Council Culture for Life Couple led the Rosary everyday of the Month of April at either Place De Bourg Elderly Home in Laplace or Twin Oaks Nursing and Convalescent Home in Laplace or in the Adoration Chapel.

SOME GRADING FORM HIGHLIGHTS

Arline and I have completed the grading form process for the current fraternal year. Every year, we are so impressed with what individual councils are doing to build a Culture of Life. We also are happy to see a variety of activities that address the evil of abortion as well as other issues endangering human life. We thought it would be good to share just a few examples from this year's forms:

Knights from Council 1286 joined the Pro-Life Group at St. John the Evangelist Cathedral in Lafayette to distribute educational materials concerning pre-natal services and the importance of voting your Catholic conscious.

Council 1905 in Gretna sponsored a Culture of Life Night at the Council home with guest speaker Kathy Allen from Louisiana Right to Life Black Advocates for Life.

Council 4508 in Metairie held a Baby Bottle Campaign for Catholic Charities Access Program, rasing \$4,266.

Council 5013 in Houma sponsored a pro-life living rosary with our religious education children. Attendees included 5th, 6th, 7th, & 8th graders, teachers, parents, along with 12 knights. It was a beautiful and prayerful afternoon. Everyone took part in praying the rosary. The council chair couple spoke to the participants about their part in being active as a pro-life teen. Everyone was given a candle, and rose to hold as they prayed the rosary.

After each child led their prayer, they placed the candle on the floor and then presented a rose to the Blessed Virgin Mary. After the rosary, the lights were dimmed to give them a chance to see the rosary illuminate the room and meditate with soft music playing in the background. One of the knights then talked with them about the role of the Knights of Columbus in the church and the pro-life movement.

Council 8770 in Maurice received a request from the St. Marquerite home that they were in need of household supplies due to an increase in expectant mothers. An email was sent to the council and the response was tremendous. A substantial load supplies from washing detergent to diapers was delivered. They also held a diaper drive at St. Alphonsus parish to support the babies of the Desormeaux foundation St. Marquerite home.

Council 8840 in Mathews had a pro-life Mass at St. Hilary Catholic Church. The council decorated a baby bassinette with pro-life material. Inside the bassinette were pink and blue rosaries and pro-life cards. The rosaries and cards were given out to remind the parishioners to pray for the unborn.

Council 12989 in Lacombe distributed flyers providing the Presidential candidates position on the life issues. They also had a "Vote Pro-Life" banner surrounded by wooden crosses placed in the front of the church property.

Council 13819 in Houma conducted a pro-life baby shower in the month of October to benefit Hope Restored for Life Crisis Pregnancy Center. A crib was setup in the church lobby to collect toys, diapers, formula, clothes, etc. for the center's supply closet that gives new mothers supplies to get started.



HELP NEEDED TO GET ULTRASOUND FOR WOMAN'S NEW LIFE CENTER

The Woman's New Life Center is located directly adjacent to the Abortion Mill in Baton Rouge. The ability to show pregnant women their child in the womb has a huge influence on their decision to not have an abortion. Therefore, this is a critical part of their pro-life work.

However, their current ultrasound machine does not provide a clear image of a baby's heart (and the ability to show a heartbeat). Also, the vaginal probe is non-diagnostic, so it does not provide accurate measurements of the embryo. This makes it hard to determine stage of pregnancy. Furthermore, it is unable to see the uterine wall and cervix to confirm an intrauterine pregnancy. Training users without a sonography background is challenging on these machines. In summary, the machine is so outdated that they are unable to provide clients with clear and accurate pictures of the baby and measurements to determine stage of pregnancy.

They are looking for a council (or councils) to participate in the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative, and purchase a new ultrasound machine for the Woman's New Life Center.

We help them TAKE TIME. Research shows that 77% of the time when women thinking of abortion see an ultrasound of their baby, they choose life.

Alas, every good thing needs money to run though. That's why we are having a Men for Mary's House Raffle. I have met so many men who are pro-life, and ask how they can help. This is one way. Raising funds, winning prizes and spreading the word about Mary's House Pregnancy Care Center - three ways men can show they are pro-life - MEN FOR MARY'S HOUSE!

John Billiot #2732 of Slidell donated bottled water, #5663 Cudovicom Council Red Beans and Rice, St. Dominic's council Breakfast Casserole (YUMMY), #13425 St. Matthew in River Ridge Jambalaya, and still yet another fantastic Jambalaya from #9007 Bishop Caillouet Council, St Rita's Council #3854 donated Pulled Pork and Coleslaw.

May 11th will be a day of pro-life activities in Baton Rouge, and we hope you will make plans to join us!



These children come from every walk of life – some abducted, others lured by traffickers. They are then transported to other states where they are forced to perform sexual acts, sometimes as often as 20 times a day. The impact on trafficked children is devastating.

The victims of human trafficking are nothing more than income-producing property for their handlers. They have each been robbed of their childhood. There is no joy in their lives.

"Two overarching statements which will help to summarize the conclusions of the Roman Catholic Tradition on many of the [bioethics] issues to be discussed are these: even with the best of intentions, persons may never be used as a means to an end; their dignity requires this prohibition; second, human beings are stewards of their lives and of all Creation, not masters."

"Special attention must be given to evaluating the morality of prenatal diagnostic techniques which enable the early detection of possible anomalies in the unborn child. In view of the complexity of these techniques, an accurate and systematic moral judgment is necessary. When they do not involve disproportionate risks for the child and the mother, and are meant to make possible early therapy or even to favour a serene and informed acceptance of the child not yet born, these techniques are morally licit. But since the possibilities of prenatal therapy are today still limited, it not infrequently happens that these techniques are used with a eugenic intention which accepts selective abortion in order to prevent the birth of children affected by various types of anomalies. Such an attitude is shameful and utterly reprehensible, since it presumes to measure the value of a human life only within the parameters of "normality" and physical well-being, thus opening the way to legitimizing infanticide and euthanasia as well."

"Scandal is an attitude or behavior which leads another to do evil. The person who gives scandal becomes his neighbor's tempter. He damages virtue and integrity; he may even draw his brother into spiritual death. Scandal is a grave offense if by deed or omission another is deliberately led into a grave offense. Scandal takes on a particular gravity by reason of the authority of those who cause it or the weakness of those who are scandalized. It prompted our Lord to utter this curse: 'Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened round his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea.' Scandal is grave when given by those who by nature or office are obliged to teach and educate others. Jesus reproaches the scribes and Pharisees on this account: he likens them to wolves in sheep's clothing." (CCC 2284 and 2285)
