

Abortion decreased by 4% in Louisiana from 2015 to 2016!

This means that ONE BABY who would have been aborted every day in 2015 was saved in 2016!

There were 9,362 abortions in Louisiana in 2015, and there were 8,972 in 2016. The 2016 total also means there has been a 14% decrease in abortions since 2014. (You can read more about the statistics here.)

Just like you, we hope (and work) for a tomorrow without any abortions. We pray that comes sooner rather than later. But for today, we are thankful for the lives saved that will enjoy the blessings of Louisiana!

We continue to assist a local safe house, the <u>Free Indeed Home</u>, where girls ages 12-17 who have been sex trafficked can come for healing.

If you or your group would like to participate in the collection of much-needed items, please contact the Respect Life Office at respectlife@arch-no.org to facilitation this. No drop-offs can be accepted.

REQUEST FOR HELP TO END ABORTION

This is a request from Archbishop Aymond: With the recent closures of facilities in Bossier City and Metairie, there are three remaining abortion clinics operating in the state of Louisiana, one within the city of New Orleans — Woman's Health Care Center on General Pershing Street. On any Tuesday through Friday mornings, there are upwards of 25 women waiting in line to enter the clinic, while there may be at most only one sidewalk counselor present to offer support.

If you are interested in becoming a sidewalk counselor at the General Pershing Street abortion facility, please contact the Archdiocesan Respect Life Office at 504-286-1119 or respectlife@arch-no.org. The need is urgent; training and ongoing support will be provided.

If you feel called to help in any way with these great needs, we have help for you to get started:

This is a note from Wilson, veteran sidewalk counselor who is at General Pershing most weekdays: "Like I have done in the past at Ridgelake, if anyone wishes to go out to the General Pershing mill at anytime after we leave to pray, witness, or whatever on a regular schedule, I will be glad to come out & help them get started."



ULTRASOUND MACHINE NEEDED IN NORTH BATON ROUGE

Barbara Thomas, Director of the North Baton Rouge Women's Help Center, sent a message to me asking for help in obtaining a new ultrasound machine.

The one that they have is outdated, and she says the company will only service it for the next year or so. I know one council by itself cannot afford to do this, but I am putting out a call for help.

ULTRASOUND NEEDED FOR GRETNA PREGNANCY CENTER

The <u>Community Center for Life</u> in Gretna provides pregnancy testing, confidential counseling, pre-natal and postpartum classes, educational literature, baby items, ultrasounds and an emergency shelter.

Their ultrasound machine no longer works, and it needs to be replaced. This instrument is essential to their pro-life work.

The cost of a new machine is estimated to be around \$33,500. This cost would include the machine, the tools associated with operating the machine, installation, training on use and also shipping.

Archbishop Blenk Council 1905 in Gretna is leading the effort to obtain a new ultrasound machine through the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initative. Their council is asking other councils in the New Orleans area to make a donation to this effort.

<u>ULTRASOUND NEEDED FOR</u> <u>WOMAN'S NEW LIFE CENTER</u>

The Woman's New Life Center is located directly adjacent to the Delta abortion mill in Baton Rouge. The ability to show pregnant women their child in the womb has a huge influence on their decision to not have an abortion. Therefore, this is a critical part of their pro-life work.

However, the machine is outdated and it is unable to provide clients with clear and accurate pictures of the baby.

Council 8147 in Gonzales will participate in the Ultrasound Initiative to obtain the ultrasound machine. They are looking for additional councils to pledge \$1,000 or more to help raise the required amount of money. Their goal is to raise, \$20,000.

MEN FOR MARY'S HOUSE RAFFLE

Mary's House offers alternatives to abortion to women with unintended pregnancies. We offer free peer counseling, free pregnancy tests and free ultrasounds to women who think they have no other option but abortion or who are just afraid and don't know what to do. We help them TAKE TIME. Research shows that 77% of the time when women thinking of abortion see an ultrasound of their baby, they choose life.

Alas, every good thing needs money to run though. That's why we are having a Men for Mary's House Raffle. I have met so many men who are pro-life, and ask how they can help. This is one way. MEMORIAL TO THE UNBORN Michael Kirby (Council 8703)

Recently Fr. Floribert Blank Council 8703 of Port Sulphur, La. assisted with the acquisition of a Memorial to Unborn Children for St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Port Sulphur, La. Pictured is Grand Knight Nolan Encalade making the formal presentation of the artwork to Fr. Gerard Stapleton, pastor of St. Patrick Catholic Church.

The sculpture is a replica of the original sculpture created by Slovakian artist Martin Hudáček who also presented another replica to Pope Francis at the Vatican in 2015. Instead of morosely focusing on the grave of the aborted baby, as many pro-life memorials do, the emphasis here is on the overwhelming sorrow of the mother as she laments her abortion. She is approached by the figure of her aborted child in an extraordinarily tender and poignant way. By placing its hand on her head, the child evokes an impression of forgiveness and reconciliation. The work has earned acclaim for its sensitive and effective portrayal of post-abortion suffering.

Following completion of some ongoing repair work inside the Church, the artwork will be installed in an appropriate place there.

PRO-LIFE CORNER

Brother Knights and Ladies,

Father's day weekend we kicked off the Access Pregnancy Center's Baby Bottle Campaign at St. Martha Catholic Church in Harvey. By July 16th, the collection had raised \$1,780. This couldn't come at a better time because their mobile clinic needs repairs to its generator. This mobile unit is the big pink van that provides the special care needed by young mothers and their babies.

The fourth and final church drive of our 2017 Combined Access Pregnancy Center Baby Bottle Campaign was held on the weekend of July 29-30th at Infant Jesus of Prague Catholic Church in Harvey in conjunction with our "Fifth Sunday" Rosary.

At the July KC meeting, our Grand Knight brought a letter from The Community Center For Life asking for donations to replace their broken and obsolete ultrasound imaging machine. We proposed to donate \$1,000 because we know the importance of that machine. The cost of a new machine is in the mid-\$30,000 range. I visited this center on July 13th, and it was a very nice and friendly place that offers all the services anyone could ask for, including an apartment the young mother can use for a couple of months until she can get stable.

They just received an old obsolete machine that was borrowed from a center in Florida. I think that they need to return it so that it can be used at the lender's other clinic. At this time, this is the ONLY full time "brick and mortar" pro-life free services clinic on the West Bank.

I want to use this opportunity to ask other councils to participate in a Yard Angel campaign. Below is a photo of one that I made 21 years ago at Council 9384, and we raised about \$800. I made them with donated fence board pieces. We will need to be the "Sponsor" council to send all the collected money to Supreme for the KC Ultrasound Initiative, doubling the results of our labors. There is only one possible issue: the Archdiocese needs to check with them and confirm that if they are operating consistent with Catholic teaching.

This year the Knights of Columbus is invited again to have a table at the New Orleans "Jazzed for Life" information day. This will be held on September 9th starting at 9 AM at Holy Cross College in Algiers (New Orleans Westbank), located on Woodlawn Drive next to the six story elderly residence on the corner of General De Gaulle Dr. and Woodlawn (that is where I met my bride 42 years ago). The director, Debbie Shinskie liked my 21 year old angel and asked me to bring one. I am planning to make instructions available.


<u>CULTURE OF LIFE</u> Mike Algero (Council 9240)



QUOTES OF THE MONTH

Question: What would you say is the greatest societal challenge standing in the way of ending abortion in America?

Scalia: Fr. Pau1 "Sexual promiscuity contraception. That might be shocking to people. Abortion is there, as the Supreme Court itself acknowledged in the Casey vs. Planned Parenthood decision, when contraception fails. That was actually one of the reasons the court upheld Roe vs. Wade in Casev. John Paul II makes the same observation about the connection between contraception and abortion. When you find John Paul II and the Supreme Court agreeing, you should probably take notice because they're not likely to agree on a whole lot of things."

Question: I was recently with a friend, and we went out to grab a bite to eat. As we drove down the road he remarked, 'It just hit me. Millions of babies are being slaughtered. Should we even go out to dinner? Should we just be working full time?' There are a lot of ways to be pro-life. Being profamily, putting your nose to the grindstone at work, and getting home and eating dinner with your family. Can you think of other practical ways?

Fr. Paul Scalia: "It's a great question. Let me just pick up on one thing that you said there. Should we even go about our daily lives? Should we even go out to dinner? The answer might sound callous, but the answer is yes. In my ministry, I've seen people who neglected their families in service to the prolife movement. The devil encourages us to take our strengths to an extreme, at which point they become a weakness. That's what I saw in people who were so zealous they actually neglected their own families. I think living good, authentic lives is the first thing, causing people to think, 'Gosh, that person is living a good, authentically human life, and that person's pro-life. I want to know why.' We do what we can to the extent we can. 40 Days for Life is a great thing to be involved in, the March for Life, pregnancy centers. These are all very good things. But before any of them has to be that holiness, that integrity of life that gives our witness meaning."
