A HAPPY DEVELOPMENT

If you read this newsletter regularly, you are keenly aware of our effort to get new ultrasound machines for three pregnancy centers in Louisiana:

- 1. Woman's New Life Center in Baton Rouge
- 2. Community Center for Life in Gretna
- 3. Women's Help Center in Baton Rouge

We have had serveral councils in the Baton Rouge Diocese that have made substantial donations to this effort. Nevertheless, the fundraising effort has been very difficult for several months. However, a breakthrough occurred in November that has changed everything.

St. Louis King of France parish in Baton Rouge is closing. As a result, Knights of Columbus Council 9016 will also cease to exist. The council had money set aside in a Home Corporation, so the members went to work to distribute those funds to various charitable causes.

I am very pleased to announce that Council 9016 has donated \$45,000 to allow each pregnancy center to receive an ultrasound machine through the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative!

Council 8147 in Gonzales, Council 1905 in Gretna, and Council 13632 in Baton Rouge are currently finalizing the paperwork to complete the process with Supreme.

Please say a prayer of thankgiving to God for this much needed gift for life! I will provide updates as the machines are placed early in 2018.



NO ONE SHOULD BE FORCED TO PARTICIPATE IN ABORTION

In early November, three brave nurses came to Washington, D.C. to tell their disturbing stories of coercion to members of Congress and the publicabout how they were forced to choose between participating in abortion and losing their jobs.

Cathy DeCarlo came to the U.S. from the Philippines in 2001 to advance her nursing career. In 2004, the New York City hospital that hired her assured her that she would never have to compromise her conscience by participating in an abortion. But on May 24, 2009, the hospital tricked Ms. DeCarlo into serving a patient having a late-term abortion. If she didn't assist, she would lose her nursing license, destroying her career.

"I'll never forget that day as I watched in horror as the doctor dismembered and removed the baby's bloody limbs, and then I had to account for all the pieces," Cathy said at a press conference outside the U.S. Capitol. "I still have nightmares about that day."

Fe Vinoya is a nurse in a same-day surgery unit in New Jersey where she and twelve other nurses were told they had to be trained to assist in abortions. Their jobs were threatened if they refused. "After years of working as a critical care and emergency room nurse, I never imagined that the hospital I worked for would force me to choose between taking the life of an unborn child and losing my job," Fe said. "[W]hen the government denies or coerces healthcare providers' conscience[s], it not only hurts patients and those of us committed to serving them, it also deters others from joining the profession," Fe added.

The third nurse, Sandra Mendoza, worked for eighteen years in pediatrics at the Winnebago County Health Department in Rockford, IL. In 2015, Sandra was informed that her clinic was being merged with women's health services and, consequently, all nurses would have to be crosstrained in abortion referrals and abortion-causing drugs. When Sandra objected, she was told that if she didn't participate, she could no longer work at the health department.

"Like many nurses I know... I view nursing as more than just a job, but a calling and a vocation," Sandra said. "I'm called to protect life not destroy it. I'm called to serve others and do no harm, as the Hippocratic Oath I took states. While we may not all agree on abortion, I'd hope we can all agree that no doctor or and nurse should be forced out of employment on account of their faith and commitment to protecting life."

In addition to medical providers and trainees being forced to participate in abortion, churches and others who oppose abortion are being forced to provide insurance coverage for it in a growing number of states. Current federal conscience protection laws are failing to prevent such discrimination due to loopholes and insufficient enforcement mechanisms. This can be solved, but your help is needed.

The Conscience Protection Act (H.R. 644/S. 301) fixes those loopholes and provides victims of discrimination with the ability to defend their rights in court. Contact Congress now through www.humanlifeaction.org to urge your representatives to enact the Conscience Protection Act as part of its Fiscal Year 2018 appropriations bill. Finally, follow and share the #StandWithNurses social media campaign advocating for nurses like Cathy, Fe, and Sandra. Your voice matters!

A DOWNWARD TREND Louisiana Right to Life

Abortion Numbers Continue on a Downward Trend

The number of abortions performed in the U.S. continues to decline, according to the 2014 "Abortion Surveillance Report" recently released by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Relying on reports from state health departments, the CDC reported 652,639 abortions for 2014, down 2% from the 2013 total of 664,435 and nearly 12% from the 2012 total of 730,322. While it provides a snapshot into the downward trend in abortions, this figure does not provide a complete picture of abortion in the U.S. as it does not include abortion data from California, the nation's most populous state, New Hampshire and Maryland.

In addition to the decline in the raw numbers of abortions, the CDC finds that both the abortion rate, (the number of abortions for every 1,000 women of child-bearing age) and the abortion ratio (the number of abortions per 1,000 live births) have declined. In the states included in the report, the CDC found an abortion rate of 12.1 abortions for every 1,000 women aged 15-44. The CDC found a ratio of 186 abortions per 1,000 live births.


More than two-thirds (67%) of abortions were performed at 8 or fewer weeks gestation. The advent of chemical abortions has meant that more and more abortions are performed at earlier gestations. Thus it is not surprising that just over four in 10 (41.1%) were actually performed at 6 weeks or less in 2014. CDC data shows that the number of abortions at 6 weeks or less has risen steadily since 2005.

About a quarter (24.5%) of the abortions occurred between 9 and 13 weeks. The remaining 8.5% were performed in the 2nd trimester or later: 3.3% at 14-15 weeks, 2% at 16-17 weeks, 1.9% at 18-20 weeks, and 1.3% at or beyond 21 weeks.

The CDC shows that 76% of all abortions continue to be surgical abortions (67.4% first trimester, 8.6% at second or third trimester). Most of the rest of the abortions (22.6%) were1st trimester "medical" (chemical) abortions. An additional 1.5% were chemical procedures performed at 8 weeks or more.

"Though data shows first trimester surgical abortions still dominate the industry, it also shows abortions being performed earlier and earlier, with more and more using chemical rather than surgical methods," said said Randall K. O'Bannon, Ph.D., National Right to Life director of education and research.


Human Life Sunday is January 21, 2018.

On January 22, 1984, President Ronald Reagan designated the third Sunday of January as National Sanctity of Human Life Day. Churches around our country still use this day to raise awareness about core life issues, such as abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide, embryonic stem cell research, infanticide and more. Pastors can take this opportunity to teach what the Bible says about the sanctity of human life and what the church can do to minister to the vulnerable in our society.

The third Sunday of January was chosen because it falls in close proximity to the anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision, handed down on January 22, 1973, and legalizing abortion in all 50 states, in all nine months of pregnancy, and for virtually any reason (or no reason at all).





State Capitol to Downtown Riverfront Levee Green 10 AM - Noon




ENTERING CANAAN: DAY OF PRAYER AND HEALING FOR THOSE TOUCHED BY ABORTION

If you see something, SAY SOMETHING! It is better to report a suspicious incident and be wrong than to be right and say nothing.


