

CONSPIRACY AGAINST LIFE Chelsy Gomez, USCCB

In recent weeks, the eyes of the world were drawn to Liverpool, England as the life of 23-month-old Alfie Evans hung in the balance.

Despite drawing support from across the world, including from Pope Francis and the Italian and Polish governments, Alfie's ventilator was removed against his parents' wishes on April 23. Alfie suffered from an undiagnosed neurological condition and was not expected to survive long after the removal of the ventilator. However, Alfie surprised doctors as he breathed on his own for minutes, then hours, and then days, until he ultimately passed away on April 28.

Pope St. John Paul II warned that, "A person who, because of illness, handicap or, more simply, just by existing, compromises the well-being or life-style of those who are more favored tends to be looked upon as an enemy to be resisted or eliminated. In this way a kind of 'conspiracy against life' is unleashed" (Evangelium vitae, 12).

This "conspiracy against life" has a long history that runs deep and, over the centuries, has risen to the surface in many different forms. It is unleashed when a society equates human dignity with human ability, when we no longer focus on the burdens experienced by a person, but rather view the person as a burden.

The forced removal of Alfie's ventilator happened to take place on the same day that the royal family and the British people rightly welcomed and celebrated the birth of a new little prince.

The juxtaposition of these two events is striking. Mere hours separated the happy announcement of a safe delivery of the healthy royal baby from the tragic news of the government-forced removal of life-sustaining care from little Alfie Evans.

The painful irony is that in the days that followed, as the world eagerly awaited the naming of this new royal child, it lost sight of the fact that every child deserves to be celebrated, cherished, and welcomedregardless of their class, status, or medical condition. The story of Alfie Evans is the most recent example of a growing hostility toward those whose lives are, for one reason or another, deemed to be "lesser," "futile," or "not worth living."

Consider the staggering abortion rates of preborn children diagnosed with Down syndrome (nearly 100 percent in Iceland) or patients who, diagnosed with serious illnesses, are offered insurance coverage for assisted suicide, but not for treatment. All too often, efforts to end a life are cloaked in arguments of false compassion. These lives are construed as burdensome to those around them and not recognized as the unrepeatable gift that they are to the world. The feigned desire to end a person's suffering ends a person's life instead.

Human life--created in the image and likeness of God--is always a good, sacred in all stages and circumstances, and deserving of respect and protection from all that would threaten it.

It has often been said that we can measure a society by how it treats its weakest and most vulnerable members. We must never cease to witness to the dignity of human life, especially the most vulnerable among us. May Alfie's memory support us in our efforts to end this "conspiracy against life."

LOUISIANA ABORTION RATE FALLS FOR THE 3RD STRAIGHT YEAR!

Louisiana Right to Life

The number of abortions in Louisiana decreased by 3 percent from 2016 to 2017, according to preliminary figures provided to Louisiana Right to Life recently by the Louisiana Department of Health. It was the third straight year abortion numbers have dropped.

There were 8,706 abortions performed in Louisiana in 2017, down from 8,972 abortions reported in 2016, 9,362 abortions reported in 2015, and 10,211 abortions reported in 2014. The number of abortions performed in the state had increased steadily since Hurricane Katrina before the abortion rate began to decline.

The number of abortions performed in Louisiana on women from another state, as well as parish by parish figures, have not yet been released by the state.

Some quick facts about the 2017 statistics in Louisiana:

- There were 8,706 abortions performed in 2017. That means there were, on average, 24 abortions per day.
- 27 girls under the age of 15 had abortions in 2017. Another 791 girls between the ages of 15-19 aborted their babies.
- The largest number of abortions 2,532 were performed on women between the ages of 25-29. There were also 11,132 women ages 35 and older who had abortions in 2017.
- Women categorized as "non-white" accounted for 69% of abortions performed in 2017.
- 84% of women who had abortions in 2017 were unmarried.
- Nearly 70% of babies were aborted within eight weeks of pregnancy.

"We are excited that for the third straight year abortion has decreased in Louisiana," said Benjamin Clapper, executive director of Louisiana Right to Life. "This decrease means that children were born in 2017 who may have been aborted in previous years. These babies now get to enjoy their life in the great state we call home. We believe that every life deserves a lifetime, and that no matter the circumstances that mothers in our state face, our communities can provide support to assist them both before and after birth.

"Moving forward, we hope that the option of adoption will flourish in our state and lead to an even greater decrease in abortion, giving those who are considering abortion another option that will benefit them and their unborn baby. Together, we can build a future where every baby is protected by law and welcomed into our state with love."

Even with numbers down nearly 15 percent since 2014, an average of 24 abortions per day were performed in Louisiana in 2017. Louisiana Right to Life will continue working hard to reduce these numbers until every baby is saved.



ACTIVITIES AT DELTA IN BATON ROUGE Jamie Johnson

A brief exchange of dialogue occurred between a pro-life sidewalk counselor and a lovely, young black woman named Dianna, on Friday, May 18th, 2018.

She was probably in her twenties or thirties and had a healthy glow about her. The exchange took place outside Delta abortion murder death camp mill "clinic" in Baton Rouge, LA. The conversation was recorded to encourage others to come to the defense of those still in the womb.

"Don't ever think what you're doing out here is in vain," the young woman said. "Let me tell you something," she continued. "About a year ago, I came in here [Delta], and a man standing right over there [gesturing toward the pine trees near the entrance] shouted, 'God never makes mistakes.' He said, 'Look at me!' 'Cause I was hanging my head in shame. 'Look at me!' I walked in there and something came over me. I started crying at the counter. She [presumably the receptionist] asked, 'What are you doing?...What are you doing?' [Her response to the employee's inquiries uncaptured.] 'Well don't do it!' the employee behind the counter said. "So I walked back out," Dianna continued, "and nobody said anything to me." "My baby is ten months old and he is the most perfect [again, exact wording uncaptured]." "What you're doing out here is not in vain," she reiterated. "His name is Jaris," she said, when asked, 'What is his name?' "I was 12 weeks pregnant when I came here."

After conversing about what day it may have been, she said, "I can tell you exactly what day it was: December 22nd, 2016. "You're not going anywhere until you give me a hug," the sidewalk counselor said. She and I hugged tightly. "I was gonna pass by but I said, 'No, let me go tell him."




2017-2018 USCCB RESPECT LIFE PROGRAM THEME: BE NOT AFRAID!

The American Medical Association (AMA) Council on Ethical and Judicial Affairs recently released report 5-A-18: "Caring for Patients at the End of Life CEJA Reports."

"In the council's view, despite its negative connotations... the term "physician assisted suicide" describes the practice with the greatest precision. Most importantly, it clearly distinguishes the practice from euthanasia. The terms "aid in dying" or "death with dignity" could be used to describe either euthanasia or palliative/ hospice care at the end of life and this degree of ambiguity is unacceptable for providing ethical guidance."


